

POCKLINGTON TOWN COUNCIL
TRANSPORT, LIGHTING AND ROAD SAFETY COMMITTEE MINUTES
WEDNESDAY 21st November 2018

A Lands and Property Committee meeting was held at The Old Courthouse 37 George Street commencing at 7pm on Wednesday 3rd October 2018.

Members Present: Cllr Cooper (chair), Cllr Green, Cllr Ratcliffe, Cllr Spademan, Cllr West and Cllr Winterton

In attendance: Town clerk Gordon Scaife.

1. Notice of meeting.
The notice of the meeting was proposed by Cllr West, 2nd Cllr Green and agreed.
2. Apologies for absence.
Apologies were received from Cllr Perry (Meeting at Pocklington School)
3. To receive any declarations of interest in relation to any agenda item.
No declarations of interest were declared.

4. Consider suspending the meeting to allow an opportunity for person(s) or groups to address the Council for a total of 15 minutes.

There were no members of the public present so the meeting wasn't suspended.

5. Consider continuing the meeting. The meeting hadn't been suspended.
6. Review the town bus service and consider any action needed.

The town bus service has now been operating for 9 months and passenger numbers have been slowly increasing. The clerk is to ask for the passenger figures for the winter months to see if there has been any drop off from the summer.

Councillors expressed disappointment that the service couldn't run along Amos Drive as the road hadn't been engineered to take a bus service. The clerk to check with East Riding Highways about the planning conditions.

Cllr Green proposed that the bus service should continue in the new financial year and that the service should be unregistered to allow for greater flexibility 2nd Cllr Winterton and agreed.

7. Consider and agree any actions needed for the car parks.

Cllr Perry was unable to attend and therefore it is not known whether the question has been asked to Pocklington School about when or if the planning application to create a new car park within the school is likely to be submitted.

Cllrs commented that when the school is on holiday there is no pressure on the car parks. The lack of parking spaces has an economic impact on the town centre. The school parking also has an impact on Cemetery Lane which affects residents who sometimes can't get out of their driveways.

Councillors requested that this issue of the school's impact on parking be discussed at Full Council as it is having an impact on the town.

No progress has been made on getting the East Riding of Yorkshire Council renamed.
